

Awards from Rounds 1, 2 & 3




Indiana Connectivity Program:

- Rounds 1-3 funded 508 address.
- Over \$1.6 million awarded in ICP funds across **55 counties**.


Next Level Connections Program

- \$268 million awarded in NLC funds across **83 counties**.

NLC Awards - All Rounds




Quality of Place

- Over \$4 million of public investment.
- \$25.9 million of private investments leveraged.
- HRGP projects completed across **40 counties.**


Economic Development



Indiana Main Street:

- 41 Indiana Accredited Main Streets and 77 OCRA Downtown Affiliate Main Street communities across **76 counties**.
- In 2021, IMS communities saw a public and private investment of over \$203,000.
- In 2021, nearly 600 new jobs were created and over 180 new businesses.

Community Development Block Grant:


- From 2018 through the first quarter of 2021:
 - Over 217 grants awarded to 179 communities.
 - CDBG grants have been awarded across 74 counties.
 - More than \$92,763,404 in CDBG grants have been awarded.



Hoosier Enduring Legacy Program



HELP

This program seeks to help communities to be strategic about planning for and deploying their American Rescue Plan Act funds to best leverage the full offering of federal funds and the other “buckets” of funding within ARPA.

HELP is supported by the expertise and knowledge of Ball State Indiana Communities Institute, Indiana University Center for Rural Engagement, Purdue Center for Regional Development, and Ivy Tech.

The nine communities and regions selected for the program are producing a Strategic Investment Plan that will guide community investment over the next several years.
