BIL – Formula vs Competitive Grants

Formula Funding Grants— Funding that is distributed from USDOT to State DOT's who then program projects throughout the state and metropolitan transportation planning areas.

Competitive Grant Programs – Potential recipients develop list of priority projects suited for applications and will apply directly to USDOT

Recipients – State, MPO, units of local government, tribal government, railroads, federal land management agency etc.

NEPA - National Environmental Protection Act

Pre Grant-Award

 If project has been awarded federal funds through formula funding, INDOT will assist in reviews/oversight

If project has no prior federal funding approved

- Must file paperwork with State Budget Agency
- No INDOT or FHWA review/oversight
- INDOT working with LTAP to provide On-Call Review Services
- LTAP will work with locals to make assignments for on call reviews
- Locals will work with on-call consultant to determine their fees 100% Locally funded
- On-Call Consultant could serve in oversight role to assist with any process or review elements that the NEPA consultant hired by the local might need.
- On-Call Consultant can complete a PEL-like pre-NEPA study.



Post Grant Award

- By using on call consultant, you potentially improve the overall timeline for grant implementation on projects where grant funds will be spent on PE and NEPA as well as construction
- All contracts and consultant agreements with direct recipients must be approved by FHWA before costs are incurred
- Utilizing INDOT on-call NEPA consultants ensures that local recipient is using a consultant that has met all federal requirements. Positions you to begin incurring costs the day the pre-award agreement is signed.
- LPA consultant can use one of INDOT on-call consultants to complete a CE or NEPA study.

 There may be an ability to include preliminary engineering, utility or right of way services with the on-call consultant.
